Topic	Child Development from Conception to Seven Years

Background Information/Context

An integral part of this qualification is to know and understand all aspects of how a child develops from conception up to the age of seven. As an Early Years Practitioner, you will be expected to have a clear understanding of physical, intellectual, language, emotional and social needs of children so this work helps you prepare for this.

The focus of your summer independent learning will be to know about the growth and development stages of the baby from conception to birth and the different health screening checks that are carried out during pregnancy and after the birth of the child up to the age of one year old.

Task 1 - Poster

Your first task is to produce a large detailed poster which describes the different stages of development from conception to birth.

This poster is intended to be put on display so needs to be large in size (A3). It must also be clear to read and interesting to look at, so use images and colour as appropriate. It must include detailed descriptions of the relevant stages of development with correct terminology.

You will use lots of external sources to help you gather information for this poster so need to attach a bibliography with it.

<u>Please note: If you do not have access to IT resources to produce this poster you may</u> complete this work by hand on a large sheet of paper.

Task 2 – Information Booklet

Produce a colourful booklet which can be used by mothers to be in a health clinic. The purpose of this booklet is to explain routine checks which are carried out during antenatal and postnatal care.

Your booklet must include the following:

- Tests for pregnancy
- Screening tests during and after pregnancy (both mother and child)
- Details of the antenatal care at each stage of pregnancy
- Postnatal care
- Routine checks carried out on the baby in the first year of life.

As before if you do not have access to IT resources to produce this work, it is acceptable to complete this work by hand

You will be expected to complete an assessment test based on this work soon after you start at New College Bradford.

All work must have your name on it.

You must clearly reference your work and produce a full bibliography.
